

Nouns

WHAT IS A NOUN?

A noun names a person, place, thing, or idea.

Examples: **dog** · **school** · **teacher** · **happiness**

Verbs

WHAT IS A VERB?

A verb shows an action or a state of being.

Examples: jump · sing · is · become

4) The leaves fall in autumn.

5) They are happy today.

Adjectives

WHAT IS AN ADJECTIVE?

An adjective describes a noun — it tells what kind, how many, or which one.

Examples: tall · three · shiny · soft

Adverbs

WHAT IS AN ADVERB?

An adverb describes a verb — it tells how, when, or where. Many adverbs end in -ly.

Examples: quickly · soon · here · loudly

- 1) The turtle moved slowly.

- 2) She sang beautifully at the concert.

- 3) We will leave soon.

- 4) He carefully painted the fence.

- 5) The dog barked loudly outside.

- 6) They arrived early and waited quietly.

Pronouns

WHAT IS A PRONOUN?

A pronoun takes the place of a noun, such as he, she, it, they, or we.

Examples: he · she · it · they · we

1) She gave the book to him.

2) They played until it got dark.

3) We finished our homework.

4) He told me about the trip.

5) You can sit with us.

6) It belongs to her.

Conjunctions

WHAT IS A CONJUNCTION?

A conjunction joins words, phrases, or sentences — like and, but, or, so, and because.

Examples: and · but · or · so · because

1 · UNDERLINE THE CONJUNCTIONS IN EACH SENTENCE

- 1) I like apples and oranges.

- 2) She was tired but kept going.

- 3) We can walk or take the bus.

- 4) It rained, so we stayed inside.

- 5) He smiled because he was happy.

- 6) You can have cake or ice cream.
