Honeybees

The Water Cycle

The water on Earth is always moving in a pattern called the water cycle. The sun heats water in oceans, lakes, and rivers, turning it into an invisible gas called water vapor. This process is called evaporation. As the vapor rises, it cools and forms tiny droplets that gather into clouds. This is condensation. When the droplets become heavy, they fall back to Earth as rain, snow, or hail. This is precipitation. The water then collects and the cycle begins again.
